Biographical Information:

THE SEVENTH phylum of angels, the Virtues, are represented by the dove— signifying peace, love, and the Holy Spirit of communication from both Father and Mother God. Their stone, silver, is reflected in the color of their wings, whose pale blue tips give off a brilliant, silvery-blue luminescence.

The Virtues’ primary purpose is helping us with our charts, those blueprints for our lives here on Earth that we create on the Other Side before we’re born into an incarnation. The element of the Virtues is water, signifying flexibility and change (which is what they do with our charts, if necessary).

In our charts, we choose our time of birth, our zodiac sign, our parents, our children and friends, our location on this earth, and the major events that relate to our themes (the areas we choose to perfect in this life)— and that’s just the tip of the iceberg! Each of us usually has a primary theme and a secondary theme, which we’ve chosen from a list of 45 possibilities. These themes basically determine what our lives are about, and our lives revolve around them.

On the Other Side, being in a state of bliss and wanting to perfect for God, we pick these courses of study. Our spirit guides, the Council, and our angels, especially the Virtues, are here to help us get the most out of this life that we can for God.

How the Virtues Help with Our Charts

On the Other Side, the Virtues primarily help us with our charts before we incarnate. Just before we enter this life, we go into isolation for meditation and a final review of what we want to accomplish. This is the time when the Virtues come to the foreground, helping us look over our charts one last time.

The Virtues help us review our charts one final time, just before we incarnate. It’s a little like getting ready for a trip and having the opportunity to make last-minute changes. The Virtues, unlike our spirit guides or any other phylum of angels, have the power to alter our charts without going to the Council for approval.

The Virtues wouldn’t add or delete any major points, but they certainly could modify them. Let’s take an accident, for instance. The greatest capability for modification is just before we incarnate, when we’re still with the Virtues on the Other Side. It’s at this time that we’d be more apt to say, “Okay, I did chart for an accident where I wanted to have my leg broken, because I really needed to rest and didn’t know how else to accomplish it. But I’ve changed my mind and have decided I don’t need that much rest. Instead, I’ll only sprain my ankle.” In other words, we can modify the event— without changing the actual action— by changing a minor part of it.
